Tours


The National Infantry Museum is designed for self-guided tours by our guests. For a fee, Docent-led tours can be scheduled prior to your visit.

Giant Screen Theater

The Giant Screen Theater presents large-than-life movies, documentaries and stage presentations. Show schedules and ticket prices are posted at the Ticket counter. Looking for a snack? Enjoy popcorn, pizza, candy, hot dogs, ice cream and more at the concession stand!

VR Center

The Museum's virtual reality simulators put you in the boots of an Infantry Soldier. Experience parachuting through the skies in the only Paradrop simulators in the United States. Ride in a Humvee or UH-60 Black Hawk helicopter and complete an Evacuation Operation mission with your friends! The adrenaline rush can't be beat!



THE CAMPUS

In addition to the galleries and other exhibits you'll find inside the National Infantry Museum, our 133-acre campus contains numerous outdoor monuments and memorials you'll want to include in your visit.

Heritage Walk is lined with flags of all 50 U.S. states and territories, as well as commemorative granite pavers which can be purchased through the Museum.

The Vietnam Memorial Plaza contains a 3/4 scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, DC, which has the names of the more than 58,000 service members killed during the Vietnam War, along with pavers for our Vietnam Veterans.

The Korean War Memorial details the conflict chronology along with the enduring alliance forged between our two great nations along four monolithic granite panels. The four bronze statues stand in honor of the Soldiers of the Republic of Korea, United States, and United Nations forces who fought and died in the defense of South Korea against communist aggression.

The Gold Star and Surviving Family Memorial pays homage to spouses and family members whose Soldier made the ultimate sacrifice during conflict and in the line of duty. A Soldier simultaneously salutes the memorials along Heritage Walk and the Battlefield Cross, in remembrance of all lives lost in the name of freedom.

The Global War on Terrorism Memorial bears the names of more than 7,000 Service Members killed since 9/11. The memorial is guarded by a 9 Soldier Infantry Squad and features a steel beam from the World Trade Center.

Inouye Field is where the newly trained Infantry Soldiers graduate from training each week. The adjacent grandstand has seating for over 2,000 people to watch these special ceremonies.

The Memorial Walk of Honor is a park-like setting containing monuments to dozens of Army units and associations, as well as benches and living memorial trees purchased by supporters.

World War II Company Street is a collection of seven original 1940s-era buildings used on Fort Moore during WWII. Tours are available on Saturdays at 11AM and 2PM, Sundays at 1PM, and can also be scheduled during the week.

Close by the WWII Company Street is a WWI-era steam train used to transport Soldiers around Fort Moore until 1945. Close to the stadium are several armored vehicles used by the Infantry from WWII to the Cold War to modern day.














Visitor Information
